### What is your goal at Farm in the Dell?

Farm in the Dell's mission is to "transform disabilities into abilities" through meaningful employment, a supportive community, and life experiences. We employ individuals with developmental disabilities in a non-competitive farm setting, teaching them agricultural and employment skills while giving them a place to belong.

### Can you tell us about the location and crops you grow?

Farm in the Dell is nestled on 25 acres in north Moorhead - near the Anderson Acres development. Our current garden occupies about half of that acreage - with the rest taken up by our barn, greenhouse, parking lot, bathroom facility, green space, and untilled farmland. Each year we grow over 100 varieties of veggies, herbs, flowers, pumpkins, strawberries, and more!

### What is a Garden Engineer?

Our Garden Engineers are our employees with developmental disabilities. Garden Engineers get to experience firsthand the joys of producing a bountiful harvest, while working together on farm and garden tasks like planting, weeding, harvesting, washing, packing, and more.

### Can I apply to be a paid Garden Engineer?

You absolutely can! While we don't have any openings available for the 2025 season, you are welcome to join our waiting list. Each year, we reach out to our waitlist in early spring regarding available opportunities for that year's growing season. Garden Engineer positions are currently limited to part-time during the growing season (May through October) although we are hoping to expand that very soon! **P&A Seeks Public Comment**

Bismarck, ND - The North Dakota Protection & Advocacy Project (P&A) is a federally mandated, independent state agency established to advance and assert the human and legal rights of people with disabilities. P&A provides services to individuals with

disabilities statewide. Services include information and referral, self-advocacy assistance, advocacy representation, legal representation, protective services, education and training, systems work, and legislative advocacy.

Each year P&A identifies focus areas to guide its work and use of limited resources. As part of this process, P&A is requesting input on the issues that are most important to the disability community. From May 1 - 31, people with disabilities, family members, stakeholders, and the public are invited to provide feedback by completing a survey. Feedback is anonymous and will be used to help shape P&A's focus areas for federal fiscal year 2026 which runs from Oct. 1, 2025 - Sept. 30, 2026.
