The Arc of Cass County Call to Action-SNAP Funding Crisis

The current budget impasse in Washington DC, jeopardizes SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) benefits and without funding there will be severe consequences for low-income families across North Dakota and our nation. Urgent action is needed now to move Congress toward passing an interim budget to safeguard SNAP benefits. The Arc of Cass County, along with our fellow chapters across the nation, are requesting support from our friends and partners to contact our Congressional Representatives and encourage them to find a solution on this issue.

SNAP is not another wasteful government program; its impact is direct and essential. Nationally, 12% of our total population, 41.7 million people, receive SNAP benefits, as they simply cannot afford to put enough food on the table to feed themselves or their family. Food insecurity leads to several physical and mental health issues and presents a public health risk when we face flu or other outbreaks. It also exacerbates existing inequalities in marginalized communities, leading to further disparities related to income, and access to resources.

In North Dakota, 6% or 1 in 16 people utilized the SNAP program in 2024. Of these 48,700 people 66% were families with children, 32% are folks with disabilities or are seniors. 43% of North Dakota SNAP participants are in working families. **Read on**

2026 SOCIAL SECURITY CHANGES

Cost-of-Living Adjustment (COLA):

Based on the increase in the Consumer Price Index (CPI-W) from the third quarter of 2024 through the third quarter of 2025, Social Security beneficiaries and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) recipients will receive a 2.8 percent COLA for 2026. Other important 2026 Social Security information is as follows:

Tax Rate	2025	2026

NOTE: The 7.65 percent tax rate is the combined rate for Social Security and Medicare. The Social Security portion (OASDI) is 6.2 percent on earnings up to the applicable taxable maximum amount (see below). The Medicare portion (HI) is 1.45 percent on all earnings. Also, as of January 2013, individuals with earned income of more than \$200,000 (\$250,000 for married couples filing jointly) pay an additional 0.9 percent in Medicare taxes. The tax rates shown above do not include the 0.9 percent.

inVEST Fargo Public School Program

"In Vocational Education and Social Transition"

This month I spent some time with the students and staff at Fargo Public School's inVEST program. I asked a student to summarize the program in one sentence. He responded perfectly with, "It is an opportunity to be able to learn the skills to go on your own when you have to." The individuals in the program have all completed their high school credits, but would benefit from hands-on independent living, financial, and job training before fully transitioning out of the school system.

Currently, there are 8 students, 1 instructor and 1 paraprofessional in the group. Every year the number of individuals varies and so do their skills, goals, and past experiences. The instructors take the group's experiences and needs into consideration to shape the curriculum and activities they do.

One of the most important things about being in the program is getting and keeping a job. The students get help with interview practice, grooming standards, transportation training, etc. to ensure they are prepared for employment in the community. At inVEST, they make sure the job comes first. Things like cooking, laundry, chores, outings, and budgeting are important but are the secondary priority.

"Since I started at inVEST, I now cook more at home. I've made homemade stuffed crust pizza, macaroni and cheese, and chicken alfredo. I also have a job now, so I help by paying rent to my parents. One day I want to own a business building railroad locomotives." -inVEST student



The facility has a full laundry, kitchen, living, and meeting room area. This allows students to get the full experience of making a meal, doing the dishes, freezing leftovers, washing towels, etc. Deb, the inVEST Instructor for over 10 years, makes sure there is purpose in everything they do. While cooking does teach them an independence skill, the fully home cooked meals are also given to families in the Fargo Public School system who need them. "This program is preparing them for real life. We also want students realizing the importance of their abilities to give back to the community and not just seeing services for people with disabilities as one-sided."
